# Today's Scripture

**Isaiah 60**: The return of the Jews from Exile is a sign to all nations to acknowledge the actions of a God who saves ⋄ restores.

**Ephesians 3**: Paul explains to the Ephesian Christians that his ministry is principally to the peoples of all cultures. It is also a faith that comes out of his Jewish heritage.

**Matthew 2**: The visit of the Wise Men to the infant Jesus is a story with universal imagery. The created universe & the world of intellectual wisdom & the knowledge pay homage to the Christ child.

The Anglican Church of Canada added a sixth. You can find it at Anglican.ca.


